## United Way Organizes Hurricane Relief

Local emergency response agencies came together immediately after Hurricane Harvey made landfall in Texas to develop a coordinated response from the Hot Springs area. Planners who met at the United Way headquarters included; The Salvation Army, the American Red Cross, Cooperative Christian Ministries and Clinic, Jackson House, and Project HOPE Food Bank, in consultation with the Garland County Department of Emergency Services.

Announcements through the newspaper, Dick Antoine's "Talk of the Town" radio show, Facebook, and our own electronic newsletter solicited help from the community in the form of specific donations. These included infant formula, baby food not in glass jars, pet food, diapers and wipes, hygiene products of all types, especially feminine hygiene products, and ready-to-eat snack foods. The United Way office served as the community collection point for donated goods, with our "Emergency Alliance" sending goods to a distribution center in Oklahoma in a truck provided by Salvation Army.

Completely on his own initiative, Ricky Garrett of Jessieville conducted a personal donation drive and brought an entire trailer full of goods to the United Way office, accompanied by his friend and colleague Richard Hurst. Ricky is a Captain of the Jessieville Volunteer Fire Department and is a Deputy in the Garland County Sheriff's Department.

At Ricky's direction, the Home Plate Restaurant in Hot Springs Village sent their donations to United Way as well. Restaurateurs Jim and Andrea Sparks had been collecting donations at the Home Plate from their customers, and it took William Harris, a chef at the restaurant, two flatbed trailer deliveries to haul it all in!
